- Creation of New Sustainable Products

The **International Bioenergy and Bioproducts (IBBC) Conference** invites abstracts addressing the following topics*:

- Supply and Demand of Woody and Non-woody Biomass
- Collecting, Harvesting and Preparation of Biomass
- Torrefaction and Wood Pellets
- Thermochemical and Biochemical Conversion Pathways
- Production of High Value Biochemicals and Bioproducts from Biomass
- Pilot Plant/Technology Demonstration -Case Studies
- Techno-Economic and Life Cycle Assessments of Biorefinery Pathways
- Policies & Initiatives for Advancing Biorefinery Projects

Students interested in presenting should send their abstract to Pat Stiede, pstiede@tappi.org, by **June 30, 2018**. Abstracts should be 1-2 paragraphs in length. Presenters will be notified of acceptance. If accepted, a PDF of your poster is due by September 28, 2018.

RAPID FIRE SHOWCASE

All poster presenters are also invited to participate in IBBC's Rapid Fire Showcase.

The Rapid Fire Showcase gives you the opportunity to summarize research you are working on. Attendees interested in subjects presented during the Rapid Fire oral session can visit the accompanying poster and have a more in-depth discussion with the Rapid Fire presenters during the student poster session and competition. This format offers greater exposure to presenters, as well as gives attendees a snapshot into the wide variety of research being conducted.

Rapid Fire PowerPoint Presentation - Due September 28, 2018
PDF of Poster - Due September 28, 2018

Your PowerPoint presentation should have only five (5) slides:

- **Slide 1 - Title slide:** Title of presentation, your name and your institution/group that you represent.
- **Slide 2 - Description of the work:** Description of work you have done (raw material, equipment used, process conditions used).
- **Slides 3 and 4 - Results:** Graphs and tables that show results from the work. Please do not load too many graphs or tables and render the numbers illegible. It is better in this case to have less and see more.
- **Slide 5 - Conclusions:** 3 - 4 bullet points that describe the conclusions made from the experiment.

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
